17 10	It is ordained by the City Council of the City of Cranston as follows:
18 19	<b>SECTION 1</b> . Title 2 "Administration and Personnel," is hereby amended by
20	adding the following:
21	adding the following.
22	2.90.00 Tourism Commission
23	
24	2.90.010 Created and Purpose
25	There is created a commission, to be called the Tourism Commission, the purpose of
26	which is to promote the arts, culture, recreation, and tourism within the City of Cranston.
27	
28	2.90.020 Members and Terms
29	The tourism commission shall consist of eleven members as follows:
30 21	- Two members of the City Council; one appointed by the majority party, and one
31 32	appointed by the minority party; The Director of Feenomic Development:
33	<ul> <li>The Director of Economic Development;</li> <li>The President of the Greater Cranston Chamber of Commerce;</li> </ul>
34	<ul> <li>One member of the Cranston Arts Commission, appointed by the Cranston Arts</li> </ul>
35	Commission.
36	- Two members of the public appointed by the Administration, one of which shall
37	reside in Eastern Cranston, and the other shall reside in Western Cranston;
38	- Two members of the public appointed by the majority party, one of which shall
39	reside in Eastern Cranston, and one which shall reside in Western Cranston;
40	- Two members of the public appointed by the minority party, one of which shall
41	reside in Eastern Cranston, and one which shall reside in Western Cranston;
42	The appointees shall have three-year terms. All members of the commission may vote on
43	any matter coming before the tourism commission, except as the ethics laws of the state
44	of Rhode Island may provide. After a member had three consecutive absences without
45	adequate reason, the commission may remove that member. Should a member be
46	removed, the city council will make a new appointment.
47	
48	<u>2.90.030 Officers</u>

49 At its first meeting the tourism commission shall elect a chair, vice chair and secretary

50 who shall hold office for one year. At the anniversary of the initial meeting the chair or

51 vice chair shall preside over the elections for chair, vice chair and secretary.

## 53 2.90.040 Meetings, Ouorum, and Secretary

54 The commission shall hold an official meeting monthly and may hold special meetings as 55 set by the commission. A quorum of six members shall be necessary for any action by 56 the tourism commission. Provided a quorum is present, any item must be approved by a 57 simple majority of voting members for said item to pass. The secretary shall keep an 58 accurate record of the proceedings of the commission, and the tourism commission shall 59 make and file with the city council a report of all activities at the city council meeting in 60 February and July of each year.

## 62 2.90.050 Rules and Regulations

63 The commission shall establish such rules and regulations for its government and 64 procedures consistent with the laws of the state and the ordinances of the city.

65

#### 66 2.90.060 Powers and Duties

67 a) The commission shall be specifically responsible for, but not limited to, the 68 following:

69 i)the mission of the commission shall be to promote tourism in Cranston;

70 ii)the commission shall be to ensure the continued development of a vibrant city through 71 the promotion of culture, arts, and recreation to those within, and beyond, the City;

72 iii)the commission shall assist the city council and administration in promoting tourism;

73 The commission shall have the authority and power to solicit funds or grants from b) 74 individuals, corporations and other government agencies. Such funds shall be deposited 75 in the Cranston Tourism Commission account in the city budget, to be dispensed by 76 tourism commission in pursuit of its assigned mission. Any dispersal of funds may occur 77 only with the concurrence of the mayor. Should the mayor and commission disagree 78 regarding the dispensation of funds, the dispute shall be submitted to the city council for 79 final resolution. In all cases commission expenditures shall be subject to all provisions of 80 law including local budget laws.

# 82 **2.90.070 Policies**

83 The commission shall operate as a nonprofit, nonpolitical organization devoted a) 84 exclusively to its mission.

85 The commission shall operate in the general public interest serving the b) 86 community as a whole. It shall serve no special interests.
